ENGAGE.EU is an alliance of leading European universities in business, economics, law and social sciences, which aims to provide European citizens with the set of skills and competencies they need to face the challenges of the future.

The ENGAGE.EU Think Tank provides a platform where you can focus on research and enhance your expertise by working with fellow researchers and leading experts from academia, industry and politics, and society. This forum allows you to build new research collaborations, potentially launching new projects, papers or funding applications – away from your everyday commitments.

The Think Tank brings together a small group of researchers from the 9 ENGAGE.EU universities* and aims to facilitate the interdisciplinary dialogue of ideas on subjects of societal relevance. It is a forum for intensive academic exchange where researchers address the critical societal challenges of our time, where boundaries of research are challenged, where outstanding collaborations become possible, and where space is given to original thinking and innovation.

The Think Tank research theme in Spring 2023 is:

TACKLING GENDER INEQUALITIES TO BUILD A MORE SUSTAINABLE "NEW NORMAL" IN EUROPE

In particular, we would like to encourage research in relation to the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). For instance, a research project might explore how to reduce gender inequalities with the goals to foster access to education, equal career opportunities and fair wages (SDGs 1, 4, 5, 8, 10). Similarly, projects may address psychological safety and gender inequality, violence towards women, victimology, and the trafficking of women (SDGs 3, 5, 10, 16) or justice and institutional voids related to gender inequality (SDGs 5, 10, 16, 17).

Opportunities for participating researchers

At the ENGAGE.EU Think Tank, we seek to attract researchers (Post Doctoral) from various fields, expertises and disciplines specializing in the proposed research theme.

*Since May 2022, Hanken School of Economics and Ramon Llull University are cooperation partners of ENGAGE.EU and will become full partners in 2023.

The heart of the Think Tank is a research stay in Toulouse, which will allow you to explore shared interests and build research projects with an international and interdisciplinary team of researchers specialised in similar research topics. You will also have the opportunity to gain new insights into current developments regarding gender inequalities in politics, academia, industry and society through exclusive lightning talks, round tables, and workshops.

The Think Tank aims not only to develop your professional network but should also lead to concrete outputs, such as joint publications or joint funding proposals. The participants of the Think Tank will collaboratively define their concrete goals.

To ensure the programme corresponds to your needs and expectations, details of the programme will depend on the final group composition and specific research interests.

Your research stay will include access to the university facilities in Toulouse, accommodation, travel expenses from your home institution to and from Toulouse, as well as an extensive academic and cultural programme during the core Think Tank stay.

If you are interested in joining this research adventure, we invite you to apply to this stay **in Toulouse from the 30th of May to the 2nd of June 2023**. Aside from this core week, you are also expected to participate in online meetings with the research group before the stay to explore shared interests and set project goals collaboratively, for the time in Toulouse and beyond.

Application requirements

YOUR PROFILE

The ENGAGE.EU research stays are primarily tailored to excellent researchers, from all disciplines, affiliated with the universities of the ENGAGE.EU alliance and who:

- explore topics related to gender inequality, in or affecting, Europe,
- aim to develop their expertise in their field of research,
- are interested in a collaborative interdisciplinary dialogue,
- want to engage in a pioneering project of a growing European network.

OUR EXPECTATIONS

As part of the ENGAGE.EU research stay, researchers are invited to:

- participate in preparation meetings with fellow participants in winter of 2022 and spring 2023,
- actively participate in ENGAGE.EU Think Tank activities, such as research colloquia, lunch meetings and other group events,
- be willing to exchange ideas and interact with relevant stakeholders about their research and related projects,
- stay in Toulouse for the duration of the core week,
- be interested in continuing the collaboration after the Think Tank, for example in the form of publication projects or funding applications,
- participate and present their work after the research visit.

APPLICATION

Applications for a stay at the ENGAGE.EU Think Tank are open for individual researchers and should include:

Invitations to participate will be communicated no later than 31 January 2023.

SELECTION

Submitted applications are evaluated by each ENGAGE.EU partner according to the application requirements. The Think Tank's selection committee, composed of academics specializing in multiple disciplines, will consider the best-rated applications for research stays following the preselection from ENGAGE.EU partners. See comment above.

Applications are evaluated on various dimensions:

- Established interest and relevance of research to the Think Tank core topic
- Potential for contribution to ENGAGE.EU's mission

Final decisions also consider a range of criteria for cohort composition, including but not limited to coherence and complementarity of research interests and experiences amongst group members, disciplinary balance, institutional diversity, and demographic diversity.

Please note that invitations for a research stay are not transferable to later years.

Personal data protection

The Ramon Llull University Foundation's data protection policy is based on Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 (the General Data Protection Regulation). The fundamental aspects are summarised below.

WHO IS RESPONSIBLE FOR PROCESSING PERSONAL DATA?

The party responsible for data processing is the Ramon Llull University Foundation, tax number G-59069740, domiciled at Carrer Claravall, 1-3, Barcelona (Post Code 08022), and registered in the Registry of Private Foundations of the Generalitat de Catalunya, under number 472 in the Registry.

WHAT IS THE ROLE OF THE DATA PROTECTION OFFICER?

The Data Protection Officer (DPO) is the person who oversees compliance with our data protection policy, ensuring that individual rights are properly treated and protected. Its functions include dealing with any doubt, suggestion, complaint or claim from subjects whose data are processed. You can contact the Data Protection Officer by writing to our postal address or telephone or directly to the email address dpd@url.edu.

FOR WHAT PURPOSE DO WE PROCESS THAT DATA?

We process personal data primarily to provide academic services, send communications related to our activities and services and develop business relationships with our suppliers. We process your personal data for assessing, deciding on, and processing of your application for a research stay at the ENGAGE.EU Think Tank.

WHAT IS LEGAL LEGITIMACY OF THE DATA PROCESSING?

The data processing operations that we perform are based on various legal foundations, depending on the nature of each operation.

In this case, we process data based on consent. When we send information about our activities or services, we use contact details with the explicit consent of the person who will receive such information.

TO WHOM ARE THE DATA COMMUNICATED?

We communicate data only in compliance with legal obligations. Contact details can be communicated to other institutions provided that the interested party has authorised this.

HOW LONG DO WE KEEP THE DATA?

Data are essentially kept for as long as they are required to fulfil the purposes for which they were collected, in each case. Consequently, the data must be kept for as long as necessary to preserve their legal or information value and to prove compliance with the legal obligations, but for no longer than necessary for processing purposes. Ramon Llull University will delete the personal information when the application process is performed (no later than six (6) months after the application deadline).

WHAT ARE THE RIGHTS OF SUBJECTS WHOSE DATA WE PROCESS?

Pursuant to the General Data Protection Regulation, subjects whose data we process have the right:

- To know whether data are processed.
- To be informed on data collection. At the time they provide their data, subjects must be informed of the purposes for which their data will be used, who will be responsible for processing and the main aspects deriving from this processing.
- To know what personal data are processed, for what purpose, communications made to other people, the right to obtain a copy and to know for how long they will be kept.
- To request rectification.
- To request deletion, in certain circumstances.
- To request limited processing, in certain circumstances. In this case they will no longer be processed and will be retained only for the exercise or defence of claims.
- To obtain their own personal data in a structured format that can be commonly machine-read, and to send these data to another person responsible if the data subject so decides.
- To oppose processing, if such processing is detrimental to them, except for legitimate reasons or the exercise or defence against claims.

HOW CAN THESE RIGHTS BE EXERCISED OR DEFENDED?

The rights that we have just listed can be exercised by sending a request to the Ramon Llull University to the postal address or the other contact details listed in the heading.

If data subjects fail to receive a satisfactory response in the exercise of their rights, they may file a complaint with the Catalan Data Protection Authority, using the forms or other channels accessible from its website (www.apd.cat).
