Your personal data are kept confidential and processed in accordance with the provisions of the applicable data protection laws. Pursuant to Article 13 of the GDPR, we hereby inform you about the processing of personal data in connection with the selection procedure as well as the participation in the ENGAGE.EU Joint Programme in Digital Transformation (JP).

FOR WHICH PURPOSES DO WE PROCESS YOUR DATA?

In fulfillment of its public mandate to support and strengthen international mobility (cf. § 2 and § 3 of the Austrian Universities Act) and in accordance with its role and mission as an international university, WU offers students places at the JP. Students who apply for these places have to undergo a selection procedure. We process the applicants' personal data for the purpose of carrying out this selection procedure.

If your application is successful WU will process your data for contacting you regarding the organization of the JP and connecting you with your cohort (name, contact, home university)..

WHICH CATEGORIES OF PERSONAL DATA DO WE PROCESS?

We process the personal data that you provide through the application form for the JP (name, date of birth, gender, nationality, e-mail address, phone number, name of your Master programme, home university, academic record, CV, and presentation file on digital challenge).

WHAT IS THE LEGAL BASIS FOR PROCESSING YOUR DATA?

- Art. 6 (1) item c of the GDPR – compliance with our legal obligations
- Art. 6 (1) item e of the GDPR – for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority vested in the WU
- Art. 6 (1) item f of the GDPR – our legitimate interests in
 - o providing international programs,
 - o facilitating an exchange of information and networking among participants in the programs,

DOES THE PROCESSING INVOLVE AUTOMATED DECISION-MAKING?

No, no automated decision-making (including profiling) is involved.

ARE YOU OBLIGATED TO PROVIDE YOUR PERSONAL DATA?

You have to provide us with the data that are necessary for the selection procedure and the fulfillment of our duties to organize the programme. Otherwise, we are unfortunately not able to carry out the application and organization process, which means that you will not be able to join the programme.

WHO RECEIVES YOUR DATA?

As a general principle of the programme, WU aims to facilitate an exchange of information and networking among participants in the programme in a way that is as efficient as possible while also adhering to strict data protection and privacy standards. For this reason, WU informs you about the ways in which your personal data will be disclosed:

Your name and email address will be made available to the lecturers of the courses you have been assigned to, as well as to other nominated students for the purpose of establishing contact and exchanging information.

The University of Mannheim processes your personal data to inform you about the selection result and after the selection process, when your application was successful, to organize the participation in the JP.

The University of National and World Economy (UNWE) processes your application data on behalf of the University of Mannheim as concluded in the 'Contract on Data Processing on Behalf of the Controller' between the University of Mannheim and UNWE.

The University of Mannheim has got the obligation to provide a list of participants of the JP when reporting toward the European Commission. The European Commission will receive name, subject, and home university.

HOW LONG DO WE STORE YOUR DATA?

In the event that your application is unsuccessful, your application data will be deleted six months after the end of the corresponding application period. The relevant reference date is the last day on which students may submit their application documents during the respective application period. In the event that your application for the programme is successful, your data will be deleted after 3 years.

WHAT ARE YOUR RIGHTS AS A DATA SUBJECT?

As a data subject affected by these data processing activities, any time vis-a-vis WU you have the right to information about and access to your data, correction or deletion of your data, restriction of data processing, data portability, and the right to object to the processing of your data. In addition, you have the right to file a complaint with the Austrian Data Protection Authority (Datenschutzbehörde).
